New degree-seeking students from Canada who enroll at the Hazelden Betty Ford Graduate School of Addiction Studies for fall semester may apply for a \$25,000 Pedro Luna Bursary. Priority is given to applicants who self-identify as Aboriginal (Indigenous, Inuit, or Métis), particularly those living and working in an Aboriginal settlement or working within an Aboriginal environment. The deadline for Pedro Luna Bursary applications is June 1.

## Application Requirements

The Pedro Luna Bursary Application must include:

1. Essay- Your essay should be double spaced with 12-point font and not exceed three (3) pages. The essay should focus on the following details:
  - your intent and reason for wanting to attend the Hazelden Betty Ford Graduate School of Addiction Studies;
  - self-identification as Indigenous, Inuit or Métis;
  - relevant work and intended work within your community; and
  - financial situation and need for bursary assistance.
2. Resume-Please provide a resume which details your education, work experience, credentials, and accomplishments to date.
3. Complete this Personal Information form-Please be sure to include your Canadian address, signature, and date.
4. Proof of Canadian citizenship and relevant documentation to support details of your essay (e.g. I.D. cards, CRA Notices of Assessment, etc.)
